Scholarship Amount: \$1,500 – **Will only be awarded:** \$750 fall and \$750 spring semesters (payable to the school)

Eligibility

1. The applicant must have been an HTFFFCU member in good standing with an account in their name for 180 days (join by June 30, 2025) prior to the 2026/2027 Scholarship Program.
2. Applicant is not a previous recipient/winner of the HTFFFCU Scholarship Program.
3. The applicant must be:
 - ♦ Current high school senior or equivalent.

OR

 - ♦ Current or previous student attending a two or four year accredited college/university as a full-time student. The recipients will be chosen based upon the following criteria:
 - a) Academic achievement
 - b) Character
 - c) Leadership
 - d) Community Involvement
 - e) An essay

Write an essay, of **no more than two pages** in length, a **maximum of 300 words**, a font size of 12, double spaced on 8.5" X 11" letter size paper, addressing **one** of the following questions. Essays must be **typed** and must include a heading of the question chosen.

1. Conflict, whether between nations, communities, or individuals, often requires compromise to move forward. Describe a situation where compromise can lead to resolution, and an example of a principle that should not be compromised. What are the consequences of each, and how can they contribute to lasting peace, trust or understanding?
2. Energy decisions made today can have long-term economic, environmental, and community impacts. What concerns, if any, do you have about future energy needs, and what steps do you believe society can take to ensure reliable and sustainable energy for future generations?
3. Two distinctly different monetary substitutes seem to be gaining in both value and support. Metals, such as gold and silver, have significantly increased in value related to other traditional monetary equivalents. Bitcoin and other electronic replacement currencies have also increased in relative value. What are the benefits and pitfalls of each of these? What is the appropriate monetary reality for each? Is there some other option on the horizon?
